In "The \$100,000 Stray Cat," Viann Meyer attributes her platform as a speaker and master gardener to once-orphaned kitty, Oliver. Devoted to environmentally conscious pet-care, Meyer and her family built an elaborate outdoor cat run - costing upwards of \$100,000 - where he could safely spend his days enjoying naturally grown catnip and area wildlife. The Meyer Cat Garden became a local tourist attraction, bringing more than 10,000 visitors from nursing homes to tour groups from a national garden convention.
